SUSAN C. ALDRIDGE, PhD **President, Thomas Jefferson University** **Philadelphia, PA**

Dr. Susan Aldridge is a seasoned university educator, administrator and strategist, with a distinguished career spanning 3 decades. Dr. Aldridge served on the Jefferson Board of Trustees until she became Interim President of Thomas Jefferson University in July 2023 and permanent President in May 2024.

Dr. Aldridge has held executive leadership positions in the nation's largest universities; served as a consultant to university presidents and foreign ministers of education, and business leaders; and spent 10 years as Director of Services for the Aging in Denver. She carries the academic rank of Collegiate Professor, having taught courses at Troy University and the National University of Singapore, while conducting research on health and aging policies in the US and Asia. Her research also included conducting health profiles on both sides of the US/Mexico border.

Dr. Aldridge served as President of the University of Maryland Global Campus for 6 years after serving as Vice Chancellor for the Global campus at Troy University. In addition, she served as President of Drexel University Online and Senior Vice President at Drexel University.

A well-known author and keynote speaker, Dr. Aldridge has researched and published numerous scholarly journal articles and conference papers in the areas of technology-enhanced

education; university business models; health care administration and cost containment.

As a Senior Fellow at the American Association of State Colleges and Universities, she authored a book, *Wired for Success*, which provided university presidents with innovative, research-driven, technology-enhanced models for student success and strategic business growth. Dr. Aldridge was also Principal Investigator for several US Department of HHS grants and a national HHS proposal reviewer.

Dr. Aldridge has been cited twice as one of Washington DC's Top 100 most powerful women; and has received numerous awards from such higher education organizations as the US Distance Learning Association, Women in Technology, and Campus Technology. Likewise, she was recognized by the Governor of Colorado for exceptional leadership in healthcare planning and delivery, while also earning outstanding service awards from the US Department of HHS, the US Veteran's Administration and the Social Security Administration.

Having received her Bachelor's Degree from Colorado Women's College, Dr. Aldridge completed her Master's Degree and PhD at the University of Colorado. Her doctoral research, funded by the US Department of HHS, was on the impact of Medicare prospective reimbursement on patient care outcomes.

DAVID A. BLOOM, MD, FACS AND FAAP

Jack Lapidus Professor of Urology

University of Michigan Medical School, Ann Arbor, Michigan

Dr. David Bloom was born and raised in Buffalo, New York and educated at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New York and medical school at The University of Buffalo. He was resident in Surgery and Urology with a fellowship in London at the Institute of Urology. The U.S. Army sent him to Walter Reed Army Medical Center for four years where he began his career as a urologist, becoming a Lt. Col. and associate professor at the Uniformed

Services University of Health Sciences. His next stop was the University of Michigan where he developed a large academic pediatric urology practice and became the Jack Lapidus Professor. He served as Associate Dean for Faculty Affairs from 2000-2007 and Urology Chair from 2007-2019. During his leadership the department of urology greatly expanded and he remains active in administration and patient care.



ALLEGRA BURNETTE, MFA

Museum of the American Revolution

As Chief Strategy and Growth Officer of the Museum of the American Revolution, Allegra works to expand the Museum's reach and impact by identifying, developing, and implementing strategic growth initiatives. She oversees the Museum's branding, marketing, communications, digital, and visitor service activities and help the institution harness opportunities surrounding the nation's 250th anniversary in 2026 and the Museum's 10th anniversary of its opening in 2027.

Allegra Burnette holds a Master of Fine Arts degree in museum exhibit planning and design from the

University of the Arts in Philadelphia. She received her bachelor's degree in art history from Dartmouth College. She began her museum career in 1991 at Ralph Appelbaum Associates where she filled a variety of creative roles, working for clients such as the United States Holocaust Museum, the American Museum of Natural History, the Children's Museum of Manhattan, and the Yorktown Victory Center. Burnette led digital media at The Museum of Modern Art in New York City, where she oversaw the strategy and implementation of MoMA's public-facing digital initiatives, including websites, social media, mobile apps, and digital displays.



Allegra has taught in the online museum studies graduate program at Johns Hopkins University and served as a mentor and president of the board for the Museum Computer Network (MCN), as well as sat on numerous award juries and acted as a grant peer reviewer. She is currently a Visiting Assistant Professor at Pratt Institute in New York City, where she has taught graduate classes in museum digital strategy and audience research and evaluation.

MR. DAN DIZIO **CEO and Co-Founder "Philly Pretzel Factory"** **Philadelphia, PA**

Dan began his entrepreneurial journey at 11, selling pretzels on a busy Philly corner. In 1998, he and college roommate, Len Lehman, opened the first Philly Pretzel Factory in the Mayfair section of Philadelphia. By 2004, Dan founded Soft Pretzel Franchise Systems, launching the brand

into national franchising. Today, the company has grown to 175 locations and billions of pretzels served. Dan appeared on the TV show "Undercover Boss" and earned multiple honors, including "Best Soft Pretzel" award and was an Ernst & Young Entrepreneur of the Year Award finalist.



HON. MARGARET (PEGGY) DUCKETT DRACH **Museum of the American Revolution Board of Directors** **Philadelphia, PA**

Peggy Duckett Drach, a long-standing Companion Member of CSGUS, chaired the Constitutional Conventional Bicentennial Exhibition at Independence National Historical Park and was on the founding board of the National Constitution Center. She is the longest-serving member of the National Council of the National Endowment for the Humanities, chairing the Public Programs division from 1990-2003. Afterwards, she began work on the Museum of the American Revolution as a member of the Board, continuing

through the current 250th Anniversary of the Declaration of Independence in 2026. It is also noteworthy that Peggy served on the Board of the American Foundation for Urologic Disease, leading the annual fundraising event at the AUA annual meeting, and at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia on their Board as President of the Executive Council of Volunteer Organizations. Building on her strong roots in Texas, the Governor has affirmed her selection as a "Distinguished Daughter of Pennsylvania."

SAID A. IBRAHIM, MD, MPH, MBA **Anthony F. and Gertrude M. DePalma Dean** **Sidney Kimmel Medical College** **Philadelphia, PA**

Said Ibrahim is the Anthony F. and Gertrude M. DePalma Dean at Thomas Jefferson University's Sidney Kimmel Medical College. He is also the President of Jefferson University Physicians.

Prior to joining Jefferson, Dr. Ibrahim served as the Senior Vice President for the Medicine Service Line at Northwell Health, Chair of the Department of Medicine, and was the David J. Greene Professor of Medicine for the Donald and Barbara Zucker School of Medicine at Hofstra/Northwell. Dr. Ibrahim has also held prior tenured faculty and leadership positions at Weill Cornell Medicine, the University of Pennsylvania, and the Philadelphia VA Medical Center.

Dr. Ibrahim is a National Institutes of Health (NIH) funded physician-scientist. Health equity has been a focus of his research and scholarship. His research on racial/ethnic variation in the use of knee/hip replacement in the management of end-stage osteoarthritis has been continuously federally funded for over 20 years. Dr. Ibrahim was a past recipient of a prestigious NIH K24 award – supporting his role as mentor for future generation investigators focused on patient-centered research in healthcare disparities.

Dr. Ibrahim was inducted to the National Academy of Medicine (NAM) as a member for his contributions to health, medicine, and research. Dr. Ibrahim has served as Associate



Editor of the American Journal of Public Health and as a member of the *Journal for General Internal Medicine's* editorial board. He is currently Associate Editor for The Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA) Health Forum. He also served as a NIH Council member for the National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities and for the National Institute for Arthritis, Musculoskeletal and Skin Disorders.

JULITA MITCHELL, MD **Director of the Integrative Weight Management** **Program and Lead Physician, Executive Health** **Program at the Marcus Institute of Integrative** **Health – Jefferson Health** **Villanova and Philadelphia, PA**

Dr. Mitchell is the Director of the Integrative Weight Management Program and Lead Physician of the Executive Health Program at the Marcus Institute of Integrative Health for Jefferson Health. She also serves as an Assistant Professor in the Department

of Integrative Medicine and Nutritional Sciences. Board-certified in both Family Medicine and Integrative Medicine, Dr. Mitchell specializes in a whole-person approach to health and wellness, with expertise in nutrition, therapeutic lifestyle interventions, botanical medicine, and



women's health. Jefferson's Department of Integrative Medicine and Nutritional Sciences is the first department of its kind in academic medicine, teaching integrative medicine alongside other medical school departments.

MR. MARK A. MONTANARO Curator, Philadelphia Mummers Museum Philadelphia, PA

Mark joined the Mummers Museum in the summer of 2012 as a volunteer. In the fall of 2012, Mark was appointed Curator of the Museum. Mark paraded for 55 years in the Mummers Parade with 40 years in the Comic Division and 15 years in the String Band Division. Mark is a U.S. Army Veteran and retired as civilian in Department of Defense after a 36-year career. The Philadelphia Mummers Parade is the oldest continuous folk parade in the United States. The first formal, city-sponsored parade dates to 1901. But Mummery

in Philadelphia began long before that. Mummers can be found throughout recorded history in ancient Egypt, in Greece, in Europe and elsewhere in the world. The Mummers Museum opened in 1976 as part of Philadelphia's celebration of America's Bicentennial. The Museum is dedicated to celebrating the tradition of Mummery in Philadelphia. Mummers are about celebration, fun, and family. They value tradition and community. Mummers can be musical, satirical or even a little ridiculous, but they are always colorful.



DAVID B. NASH, MD, MBA Founding Dean Emeritus Dr. Raymond C. & Doris N. Grandon Professor of Health Policy Jefferson College of Population Health Thomas Jefferson University Philadelphia, PA

David B. Nash, MD MBA, is a board-certified internist who is internationally recognized for his work in public accountability for outcomes, physician leadership development, and quality-of-care improvement. He is the Founding Dean Emeritus of the Jefferson College of Population Health and now serves as the Dr. Raymond C. and Doris N. Grandon

Professor of Health Policy. Dr. Nash is regularly on Modern Healthcare's list of Most Powerful Persons in Healthcare and is a principal faculty member for quality-of-care programming for the American Association of Physician Leaders. Dr. Nash has authored more than 100 peer-reviewed articles and edited 23 books, including "How Covid

Crashed the System", Connecting with the New Healthcare Consumer, The Quality Solution, Demand Better, and most recently Population Health: Creating a Culture of Wellness (3rd edition). Dr. Nash has generously provided copies of his Covid publications to CSGUS members attending the 2025 meeting in Philadelphia.

UNION LEAGUE OF PHILADELPHIA

Our Thursday evening welcoming reception will be held at the historic Union League of Philadelphia. The Union League was founded in 1862 as a patriotic society to support the Union and the policies of President Abraham Lincoln. The Union League of Philadelphia laid the philosophical foundation of other Union Leagues across a nation torn by civil war. The League has hosted U.S. presidents, heads of state, industrialists, entertainers and dignitaries from around the globe and has proudly supported the American military in each conflict since the Civil War. The Union League continues to be driven by its founding motto, "*Amor Patriae Ducit*" or "Love of Country Leads."

The Union League League House occupies an entire city block in the center of Philadelphia's commercial and cultural district. The building is representative of the classic French Renaissance style, with a brick and brownstone façade and dramatic twin circular staircases that lead to the main entrance on Broad Street. Built in 1865, the building was added to the National Historic Register in 1979. The League's distinguished collection of art and artifacts adorns the walls and hallways. The collection is a rich chronicle of Philadelphia's unique impact upon the American landscape from the 19th century to today and is recognized by historians and art experts as a valuable component of American history. A docent will provide a brief overview of the significance of the Union League in American history.

Today, the Union League is a private, members only, Five Star Platinum Club with over 3,500 members. It features the Inn at the League with guest rooms and suites and was voted #1 City Club in the Country in 2024. Membership counts among its members top Philadelphia leaders in business, academia, law, medicine, politics, religion, and the arts.

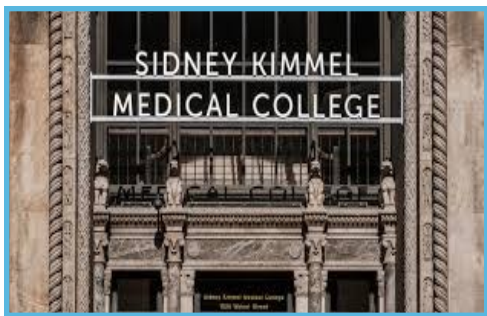

SIDNEY KIMMEL MEDICAL COLLEGE AND THOMAS JEFFERSON UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1824 as Jefferson Medical College, Sidney Kimmel Medical College of Thomas Jefferson University has awarded more than 31,000 medical degrees and has more living graduates than any other private medical school in the nation. It was the first U.S. medical school to incorporate bedside teaching of physicians in the late 1800's. In 2014, the Sidney Kimmel Foundation donated \$110 million to Jefferson Medical College, prompting the name change to Sidney Kimmel Medical College. Historically, Jefferson expanded from a medical school to a larger health sciences university that included biomedical research facilities, and schools of nursing, pharmacy and other allied health professions. In 2017, Thomas Jefferson University and Philadelphia University, formally known as the Philadelphia College of Textiles & Science and originally founded in 1876, merged, creating a comprehensive undergraduate university, including NCAA Division II athletic teams. The main medical campus is in Center City with most of the undergraduate programs housed in our East Falls campus in Lower Northwest Philadelphia. In 2024, Jefferson held a yearlong celebration to mark its 200th anniversary.



BRANDYWINE RIVER MUSEUM
CHADDS FORD, PENNSYLVANIA

BRANDYWINE RIVER MUSEUM AND CHADDS FORD

Located about 30 miles south of Philadelphia, the Brandywine Museum of Art is a museum of regional and American art located on U.S. Route 1 in Chadds Ford, Pennsylvania on the banks of the Brandywine Creek. The museum showcases the work of Andrew Wyeth, a major American realist painter, and his family, father N.C. Wyeth, illustrator of many children's classics, such as *Robinson Crusoe* and *Treasure Island*, and his son, Jamie Wyeth, a contemporary American realist painter. Jamie's "Portrait of a Pig" is a favorite at the museum.

One of the best-known images in 20th-century American art is Andrew Wyeth's 1948 tempera painting "Christina's World", which is in the collection of the Museum of Modern Art in New York City. He is also known for the controversial Helga Pictures and his paintings of windows. In addition to being awarded the Congressional Gold Medal in 1988, Wyeth was the first painter to receive the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Some pop culture trivia is that cartoonist Charles M. Schulz often referred to Wyeth in his comic strip Peanuts with Snoopy's doghouse having a Van Gogh and a Wyeth painting. Fred Rogers, of the PBS television series *Mister Rogers' Neighborhood*, had a reproduction of a Wyeth painting in the entry of the studio "home."

The area around Chadds Ford is known as "Wyeth country" because the famous family of artists who lived there. In addition to Chadds Ford's famous family, Chadds Ford was made famous by the battle of the Brandywine, which took place there on September 11, 1777. The decisive British victory allowed them to march into and occupy Philadelphia unopposed on September 26, 1777. The Brandywine Battlefield Park on Route 1 (passed on the way to the Brandywine Museum), commemorates the site of the largest single-day battle of the American Revolution with an estimated 30,000 troops. The American Continental Army was led by General George Washington, and the British Crown Forces by Sir William Howe. The battle was a major defeat for the Americans and highlighted the army's inexperience. However, this battle was considered the major turning point in the war. The resolve of American defense helped convince France that the Americans were a worthy ally, contributing to France's decision to formally enter the war in 1778 and lead Washington and the American forces to their ultimate victory.

Chadds Ford township was named for a ferry service operated by John Chadds. During the late 1730's and 1740's, the ferry service helped travelers cross the Brandywine Creek. The "Great Road to Nottingham," now U.S. Route 1, was a major north south route to and from Philadelphia and Baltimore. The crossing place became known as "Chadds Ford."



SIMEONE AUTO MUSEUM

The Simeone Foundation Automotive Museum is one of the world's greatest collections of racing sports cars. The museum's collection consists of approximately 75 racing sports cars and has been assembled over more than 50 years by Dr. Frederick A. Simeone, former chair of Neurosurgery at Jefferson. The Museum contains many historically significant cars including Ferrari, Alfa Romeo, Bugatti, Mercedes, Jaguar, Bentley, Porsche, Aston Martin, Corvette, Ford and more. Television host and comedian Jay Leno and many other celebrities visit the Museum when in town. The museum's collection of historically significant sports racing cars tells the story of how competition spurred the evolution of automotive technology. The vehicles are displayed in dioramas that depict the famous racecourses where they competed, allowing visitors to relive history and trace decades of progress in design and performance. Docent tour guides will help place individual vehicles in their historic context in the world of racing.



MUSEUM OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION

The Museum of the American Revolution uncovers and shares compelling stories about the diverse people and complex events that sparked America's ongoing experiment in liberty, equality, and self-government. Through the Museum's unmatched collection, immersive galleries, powerful theater experiences, and interactive elements, visitors gain a deeper appreciation for how this nation came to be and feel inspired to consider their role in ensuring that the promise of the American Revolution endures. Interest in the museum will be in the spotlight as we begin the 250th anniversary of the founding of America on July 4, 2026.

Located just steps away from Independence Hall, the Museum serves as a portal to the region's many Revolutionary sites, such as the Brandywine Battlefield in Chadds Ford, providing context, and encouraging exploration. The Museum, which opened on April 19, 2017, is a private, non-profit, and non-partisan organization. Museum's rich collection of Revolutionary-era weapons, personal items, letters, diaries, and works of art. Immersive galleries, theater experiences, life-sized tableau scenes, and recreated historical environments bring to life the events, people, and ideals of our nation's founding and engage people in the history and continuing relevance of the American Revolution.

A member of our CSGUS family, Peggy Duckett Drach, was a founding member of the museum and continues to serve on the Board of Directors. We are most appreciative of Peggy's involvement with our 2025 CSGUS and our planned events at the Museum of the American Revolution. Docent tour guides are available to take small groups through the museum during our reception. We look forward to a group photo with our members and accompanying guests at the Museum along with the announcement of the 2025 John Barry Award winner.
